Bands to March in Vets Day Parade

Yellow jackets, bobcats, panthers, scorpions, bulldogs, and cougars will all sound off November 11 as marching bands from Arlington Heights, Benbrook, Paschel, South Hills, Trimble Tech, and Western Hills high schools perform in the Tarrant County Veterans Day Parade.

The student musicians will be “Saluting TCU Warriors” –theme of this year’s celebration. They’ll step off at 11 a.m. that Saturday from Fort Worth’s Panther Island Pavilion parking lot, march down North Forest Park Blvd. along the Clear Fork of the Trinity River, and return.

This year marks Texas Christian University’s 150th anniversary. In concert with TCU’s celebration, the Tarrant County Veterans Council is saluting the university’s military legacy, its Army and Air Force ROTC programs, while honoring TCU alum and Medal of Honor recipient Maj. Horace S. Carswell, Jr.

“Everyone can join in saluting TCU’s ROTC cadets, and all military veterans who have, are and will continue to make great contributions,” notes Council President Dan Zmroczek. “Simply visit our website (www.2023SaluteTCU.com) where you can learn how to support, volunteer, and take part in this year’s event.
